"Pathways to Progress" – Charting the course for women and girls in our community

During the spring of 2008, the WNY Women's Fund organized a meeting of the largest providers of services to women and girls in WNY. The goals were to identify the most important needs of women and girls in our community, how success in resolving such needs could be measured, and the most effective role the Fund could play. The attendees prioritized needs for (1) baseline information (2) indicators for measuring progress over time (3) policy insights and (4) strategic recommendations. Five issues were identified as foci for this work:

- Economic security
- Education
- Health and well being
- Violence and safety
- Leadership and political participation

The UB Regional Institute is the independent researcher of *Pathways to Progress* and is providing in-kind support to the project as well. The Women's Fund is the lead underwriter, committing \$45,000 to the project. Additional funders include the Community Health Foundation of Western and Central New York, and the Robert J. and Martha B. Fierle Foundation.

An Advisory Committee of thought leaders with deep expertise in specific areas was organized in the fall of 2008. This leadership group will ensure that the voices of ALL women and girls in WNY are heard. The findings will be complete in the fall of 2009. The Women's Fund is committed to securing this information, and sharing it broadly so the entire community can understand these needs and can participate in developing actions that address them. The Fund will use this information to make strategic investments that give all women and girls the opportunity to thrive.

WNY Women's Fund Leads the First New York State Summit of Funds

Six women's funds from across New York State gathered together in September, outside Seneca Falls in Lake Geneva, to share best practices and explore opportunities to work collaboratively. This meeting marked the first time a group of US women's funds gathered together on a state-wide level. The WNY Women's Fund led the organization and implementation of this important meeting. The Funds attending ranged from, those with modest but growing budgets to the New York Women's Foundation, which invests nearly \$1,000,000 in its community.

The Women's Funding Network (WFN) facilitated the two-day meeting. In total, there were more than 20 staff and board members in attendance. The New York Women's Foundation has offered to have other Funds visit them and learn about their highly successful grants process. A lively discussion took place around collaborating on advocacy platforms, and those discussions will continue in the future.

BlueCross Blue Shield Football 101

On September 15, 2008, nearly 100 women from across Western New York participated in BlueCross BlueShield Football 101 at the Bills Field House. Chaired by Board Member **Marcia O'Neil-White** and hosted by the Buffalo Bills, this annual fundraiser is a unique opportunity to go behind the scenes with Bills current players, alumni and staff. The women split up into teams and their "coaches" (the current players and alumni) taught them the X's and O's of the game. The focus this year was on real game-day action, as the teams ran actual plays, wore official NFL equipment and were given an inside look at the players' rituals and routines. Vic Carucci, senior writer for NFL.com, kicked off the event with his insight into the Buffalo Bills and his career as an esteemed sports journalist. John Murphy, WIVB sports director and Bills play-by-play announcer, capped off the evening with an entertaining, hands-on look at preparing for an actual NFL radio broadcast. At the end of Mr. Murphy's presentation, he rolled an actual game tape and two knowledgeable fans took the reins as play-by-play and color analysts! Every participant walked away from the event with a better understanding of the game, complete with their own official handbook. This popular fall fundraiser also included a delicious meal. CASH Grants Update

Individual Development Accounts (IDA) Program

Regularly-scheduled orientation sessions are being held locally for individuals who are interested in participating in an IDA. More than 50 people have attended one of the IDA orientations and more than 20 are currently participating in the program.



CASH Coaches

Each CASH Coach provides their client(s) with information regarding free tax preparation, financial education, homeownership, and small business start-up opportunities, all of which are services now available through the IDA Program. Coaches and their clients create reasonable budgets and meet on a regular basis to execute financial plans.

CASH Coaches Spotlight: Kelly Klinger

We met Kelly Klinger in the Spring/Summer 2008 edition of this newsletter.

As you will recall, Kelly is a dedicated volunteer of the CASH Coaches Program. A professional in the banking industry, Kelly decided to become a CASH Coach because she recently took control and ownership of her own finances, and she wanted to help others experience the same sense of empowerment and control. She loves

being a part of the CASH Program because it gives participants the opportunity to talk about a topic (personal finances) that can be uncomfortable and, even at times, embarrassing. Kelly has been assigned one CASH client* so far, and meets with her bi-monthly. Originally, the client was overwhelmed with her financial situation and didn't know where to begin. Kelly was quickly able to establish trust and a sense of teamwork. Their first step was to create a written plan, which has already proven to be an effective way to organize bills and set

achievable goals. Since they first began meeting in the fall of 2008, the client has gained confidence in her financial situation, began achieving her short-term goals and is "on the road to taking ownership of her financial obligations and, eventually, achieving all of her long-term goals". Kelly will continue to update the Fund on her clients and their progress as participants of the CASH Program.

*All CASH Program clients are unanimous for the purposes of this publication.
